APPROVAL OF MINUTES

Dr. Flaherty made a motion to approve the minutes from the regular College Council meeting of April 17, 2023, seconded by Mr. Klinger. Voice vote carried the motion unanimously.

OPERATIONAL ASSEMBLY

Dr. Tharakunnel reported on highlights given at the May 8 Operational Assembly meeting. The 3rd Annual Auto Show was held on May 7 with over 600 cars and 1500 people attending. Adult Education graduation will be held on June 8 at 6 pm. Financial Aid has started automatically awarding Pell and Work Study for Fall 2023. The automatic award is made to eligible students within 48 hours after the FAFSA has been received. Graduation regalia is available for pick up. Student Affairs has a new initiative similar to Summer Refresh for adult education students called Summer Scholarship Grant. The Connect2College summer bridge program is now open. Business & Facilities has two major projects this summer: window replacement in D and E buildings and asphalt in parking lots 10 and 11. Several Admissions events are being held for students and parents, including New Student Wednesdays every Wednesday in June and July. Technology is working on migrating to the new Ellucian Experience and a new phone system in June. DEI events are updated on the website with new resources for Asian American Pacific Islander heritage month and resources in both the Library and PDC. Research has completed the Market Share Report from in-district high schools and also the Graduate Success Report, which are both available on the portal.

ACADEMIC SENATE

Dr. Flaherty provided an update on the Academic Senate and its subcommittees including the following. Curriculum has approved a barber certificate and there are questions about a beautician or cosmetology certificate. Academic & Scholastic Standards brought back their syllabus recommendations, it passed 13-8, and was sent to Vice President Campos. Academic Support brought forth a proposal to go back to the pre-pandemic late registration policy. That proposal passed unanimously and the Senate's recommendation was also sent to

Vice President Campos. Campus Quality will be looking at welcoming strategies for LGBTQ students next year. The classroom observation form will be brought back to Senate for a vote at the first meeting in September. Academic Senate meetings will continue to be held on Blackboard.

STUDENT SUCCESS

Ms. Tiwari reported that Guided Pathways student focus groups looking at program maps are ongoing. Any recommendations resulting from these groups will be implemented by this fall.

NEW BUSINESS

SUMMER REFRESH

Vice President of Enrollment Management & Student Affairs Jodi Koslow Martin reviewed last year's Summer Refresh, which was funded from COVID dollars. This program allows students who received a D, F, or W in fall or spring to retake up to two courses in the summer—if the same course is offered—for no cost.

In 2021, 1750 students were eligible and 440 students took courses. 238 continued on in the fall, 10 graduated at the end of summer 2021. In 2022, 2572 students were eligible, 490 enrolled in summer, 261 enrolled in fall, and 24 applied for graduation. The course success rate for students who retook classes in the summer is over 60 percent, and those who went on and took courses in the fall had a success rate of 75.9%, which is higher than the average 72%. This summer there are 2472 eligible students and 237 enrolled for summer so far, and the number is expected to increase.

Dr. Koslow Martin reported on another similar program that is new this summer for Adult Education students through an ICCB grant. It will offer adult students over 25 the opportunity for free classes.

Council members commented that the Summer Refresh numbers look good for this population. Discussion ensued about the many variables as to why a class is failed and how students can be reengaged.
