

Operational Assembly: Hilary Meyer provided these highlights. Continuing Education and Adult Education have increased enrollment this summer. The Library is planning a Homeschooling Open House in June to showcase college resources available to these students. Registration rallies will be held in June and July. HR reminded that the Summer 4-Day Work schedule begins the week of Memorial Day, and to use any required PTO by the end of the fiscal year. IT reported that the requisition approval process has been finalized and transition to the new process is being planned. Canon copiers will be upgraded across campus in July. An overview was given on *Project Access*, which promotes equitable dual credit opportunities to the Proviso High Schools. Research reports now available on the portal are: High School Market-Share, High School Placement, and Graduate Success.

Academic Senate: Michael Flaherty provided these updates. The Professional Development Committee is planning the Fall Faculty Workshop, which will include a focus on AI. Beth Dunn was elected as Senate Chair for academic year 2025.

Student Success: Program Director Tatianne Butler presented on the TRIO Student Support Services program events held this year, including workshops, travel, and cultural activities. The program is funded to serve 165 students, and this year there were 46 TRIO graduates. Plans for the summer include increased campus marketing and programming for students such as regional school visits and teambuilding events.

College Council Goal 1: *Council will engage in the campus-wide preparation for the HLC Reaffirmation of Accreditation visit.* Purva DeVol highlighted the ten-year reaffirmation of accreditation from the Higher Learning Commission.

College Council Goal 3: *Council will provide feedback on improving the student experience on campus.* Purva DeVol and Ty Perkins presented results of a student survey regarding awareness of services and programs on campus. Student representative Journey Manuel discussed improving communication with students.

Compliance Reporting: Equity Plan: Purva DeVol explained the Illinois Higher Education Equity Plan & Practices which are student-centered practices designed to meet the needs and support the success of historically underserved and underrepresented students so that all students have the tools they need to succeed. The college's Baseline Equity Plan was sent to the ICCB and work is now beginning to engage employees campus-wide in updating the plan for next year.
