Our Impact on Volunteers!

Accordingly to a 2019 longitudinal study, AmeriCorps volunteers were healthier, less stressed, and less socially isolated than those who did not serve.



Volunteering Statistics:

- \Rightarrow 88% reported fewer feelings of isolation
- \Rightarrow 84% reported stable or improved health
- \Rightarrow 78% reported fewer symptoms of depression

RSVP'\$ 2025 Tax Season

RSVP is again offering FREE tax assistance to eligible senior citizens in the area, thanks to a supplemental grant awarded by the Internal Revenue Service called the Tax Counseling for the Elderly (TCE). This program helps individuals aged 60 and

older from low- to moderateincome households prepare their annual tax returns.

RSVP has been awarded the TCE grant for 35 years, serving thousands of people in surrounding communities. Each year, RSVP recruits volunteers to become trained and certified to assist people with taxes.


