

What Does an Online Course at Triton Look Like?



- Learning happens in a structured online environment via a learning management system (LMS). Here at Triton, our LMS is Blackboard Learn Ultra.
- There is no physical classroom, but a supportive and connected learning community of your peers and instructors happens online.
- Most courses are asynchronous (i.e., no scheduled live classes), but hybrid sessions require in-person visits to Triton. In many instances, this is for labs or in-person exams, but can also be for a regularly scheduled class session. The syllabus will detail the schedule and modality.
- Instructors engage through emails, announcements, lecture notes and virtual office hours. You can expect the same timely feedback from instructors as you would get from an in-person class, typically within 24-48 hours.
- Activities may include discussion boards, assignments, quizzes, video conferencing, multimedia projects and more.

WHAT TO EXPECT IN AN ONLINE COURSE

If you are self-motivated, organized and eager to engage in a dynamic digital learning space, online courses can be a great option! Wondering what to expect in an online or hybrid course? Here's a glimpse:

- Expect the same rigor, prerequisites, academic requirements, credits and transferability as traditional courses.
- Expect multiple learning modalities of content, including recorded lectures, readings, videos, infographics, audio clips and interactive content.
- Expect active engagement with instructors and classmates through discussion boards, group projects, online office hours and more.

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
